THE LAUREL HIGHLANDS: A HIKING GUIDE

This guide covers the foot trails of Chestnut Ridge, Laurel Ridge and Allegheny Front in southwestern Pennsylvania. 446 miles of foot trails are described and mapped. These are mainly in state forests and state parks (218 sq. miles of public land). Some of the more popular areas covered include Quebec Run Wild Area, Roaring Run Natural Area, Ohiopyle State Park, Linn Run (State Park and State Forest) and the Laurel Mountain area.

Many trails are of interest to backpackers and cross-country skiers, so the guide includes information useful to them also. (The Guide does not cover Laurel Highlands Trail – see below.) Updates to the trail descriptions through 10-15-2011 are on <http://alleghenysc.org/trail-guide-updates>

This trail extends 113 kilometers (70 miles) from Ohiopyle State Park to Conemaugh Gorge along the top of Laurel Ridge. It is mostly within Laurel Ridge State Park but it also goes through state forests and state gamelands. Includes information on the geology and geologic history of Laurel Ridge, tree identification, climate, vegetation, wildlife, current land use, and a cultural history of the area. Published by Pa.
